

BIGGER: Message Discussion Questions

WEEK 1

Opening Discussion:

1. Share a time when you faced something that seemed impossible. How did you handle it?

Key Takeaways:

- 1. God is bigger than any impossibility we will ever face.
- 2. Replacing God with "small g gods" or temporary fixes always leads to disappointment.
- 3. Our relationship with God can always be repaired, no matter how broken it may seem.
- 4. Trusting God completely means believing there are no other options.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. In the story of Elijah and the prophets of Baal, what stands out to you most? Why?
- 2. In what ways have I tried to keep "backup gods" or other sources of security in my life besides God?
- 3. Consider the idea of "repairing the altar of your heart." What does this mean to you practically?
- 4. Ephesians 3:20, Jeremiah 33:3. How often do I pray boldly, believing God can do more than I ask or imagine? Have I asked Him to?
- 5. How can we distinguish between using God-given resources and making those resources into idols?
- 6. What are some areas in your life where you struggle to believe God can do the impossible?

Practical Applications:

- 1. Identify Your "Backup gods": Take time this week to reflect on what you tend to turn to instead of God when facing challenges.
- 2. Choose one area of your life where you've neglected your relationship with God and take a step to "repair the altar" (e.g., dedicated prayer time, Bible study, act of service).
- 3. Write down one "impossible" situation in your life and commit to praying about it daily, trusting in God's power.
- 4. Share with a partner one way you want to trust God more fully this week and ask them to check in with you.

Pray Together: Close by having group members pray for each other's "impossible" situations, affirming God's power and trustworthiness.
